

Eligibility

- Be qualified to receive tax-exempt contributions as defined by the IRS
 - Approved 501(c)(3) public charity nonprofit
 - Approved 501(c)(3) non-public charity nonprofit requires additional vetting
 - Unit of government
 - Non 501(c)(3) nonprofit requires additional vetting
- Use a qualified 501(c)(3) public charity nonprofit as Fiscal Sponsor
- Have a request that directly benefits the constituency or program related to the fund
- Do not have an open grant or outstanding final evaluation



Restrictions and Limitations

- Annual campaigns
- Costs that were incurred prior to the anticipated grant approval date
- Endowments
- Loans, scholarships, fellowships, honorary awards, travel grants
- Multi-year funding, on a case-by-case basis
- Operating or programs deficits
- Re-granting, on a case-by-case basis
- Requests from individuals





Restrictions and Limitations Not all inclusive - reference individual fund


- General operating expenses
- Religious organizations may only apply through a secular qualified 501(c)(3) public charity nonprofit for community-wide programs
- Individual School Districts and School District Foundations
 - School Districts collaborating with one or more other Districts may be eligible
- Services limited to a select membership

Submission through February 15, 2024

- Little League Fund for Youth Sports Youth activity and healthy living programs through sports for youth under the age of 16 and people with special needs in Lycoming County
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$5,700
 - Minimum Request \$500. Maximum Request \$3,000.



Submission through March 1, 2024

- **Pearls with a Passion Fund** Support for mental health therapies for any age in Columbia, Lycoming, Northumberland, Tioga, and/or Union Counties
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$32,000. Minimum/Maximum To Be Confirmed.
- Plunketts Creek Township Foundation Fund Programs/projects for the benefit of residents of Plunketts Creek Township, Lycoming County
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$14,500. No Minimum/Maximum.
- Waldron Memorial Fund Programs/projects for the benefit of the residents of Muncy, Lycoming County
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$146,000, No Minimum/Maximum.



Submission through June 1, 2024

- Greater Susquehanna Valley Grant Cycle
 - * Montour, Northumberland, Snyder and Union
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$100,000
 - Minimum Request \$5,000. Maximum Request \$25,000.
- Williamsport Lycoming Grant Cycle
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$143,000
 - Minimum Request \$5,000. Maximum Request \$15,000.

Submission through October 1, 2024

- Fath-Greene Animal Welfare Fund Programs/projects that support animal welfare in the immediate vicinity of Coudersport and Potter County
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$29,800. No Minimum/Maximum.
- Lindig Lewisburg Foundation Fund Programs/projects for the benefit of residents of the Borough of Lewisburg, Union County
 - 2024 Available to Grant = To Be Confirmed. No Minimum/Maximum.
- Lycoming Economic Development Foundation Fund Programs/ projects that address economic development in Lycoming County
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$56,600. No Minimum/Maximum.



Submission through October 1, 2024

- Century Funds Programs/projects for qualified nonprofits in Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Snyder and Union County
 - 2024 Available to Grant = \$25,000 per organization mission
 - Fund for the Arts
 - Fund for Human Services
 - *Fund for Strong Neighborhoods e.g. education, environment, government, health, recreation

Preference will be given to programs/projects that cross county lines





Submission through January 2, 2025

- Ralph and Josephine Smith Fund Programs/projects for the benefit of residents of the Warrior Run School District
 - 2025 Available to Grant = To Be Confirmed. No Minimum/Maximum.
